

# Getting to the Venue

## Address:

Łojasiewicza 6, Kraków

You can skip Ł, ó and type L, o, etc. in google maps.

## Public transport:

You need to reach “Norymberska” stop (Tram lines 11, 17, 18, 52, direction: “Czerwone Maki P+R”).

Google maps works very well in showing the routes and times. The tickets can be bought from vending machines located at tram stops. You should take 6 PLN ticket if you want to be safe (it's 1h trip and you can switch the lines during your trip). If you are sure you can make it in 20 minutes, you can buy 20 minutes 4 PLN ticket, valid only on a single line.

For guest located at Rajska and Mostowa Fragola Apartmets:

From Rajska 3: take Tram no. 18 from “Teatr Bagatela”.

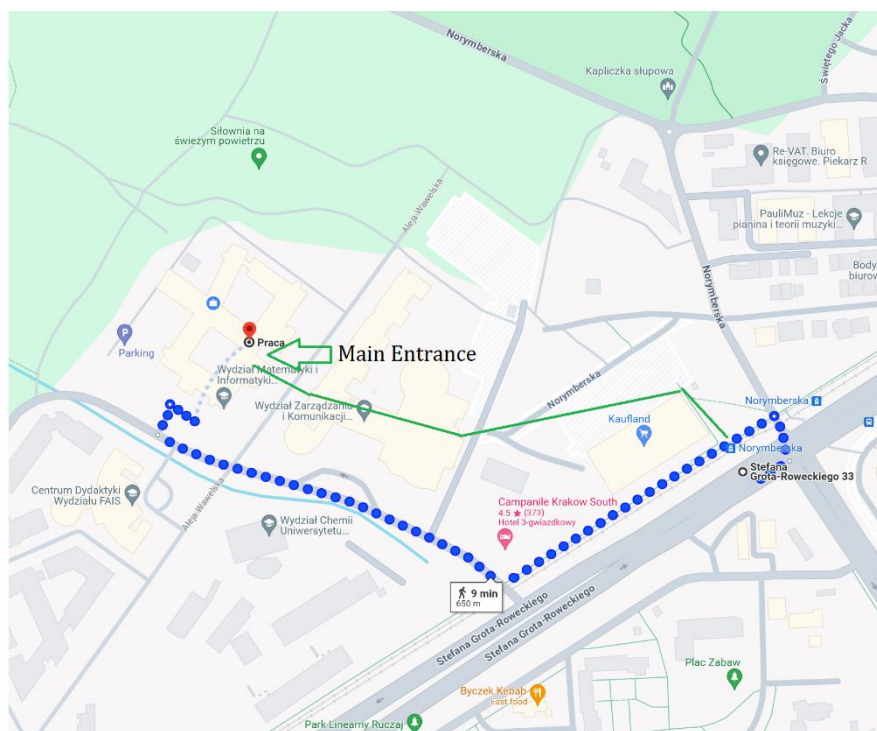
From Mostowa: take either Tram line no 18 or 52 from “Stradom”, or cross the river and take Tram no. 11 from “Korona”.

## By Taxi:

Uber and Bolt works well in Kraków. If you are taking a taxi, ask in advance what is the cost (especially from/to the airport). Trusted Taxi company is e.g. Radio Taxi Barbakan (+48) 609 400 400

## Accessing the building

From “Norymberska” tram stop you need to walk about 500 m. The main entrance is showed on the map. You can go along the street, or you can cross the parking of the supermarket and go through the Faculty of Management and Social Communication.



# Inside the building

## Interactive map:

In general, first digit of the room indicates the floor where it is located.

Registration desk will be organized in rooms 0137 and 0138, ground floor – go straight from the main entrance, they will be on the right, with glass walls.

## Rooms:

**1093**, first floor – our main Aula. All talks will happen there.

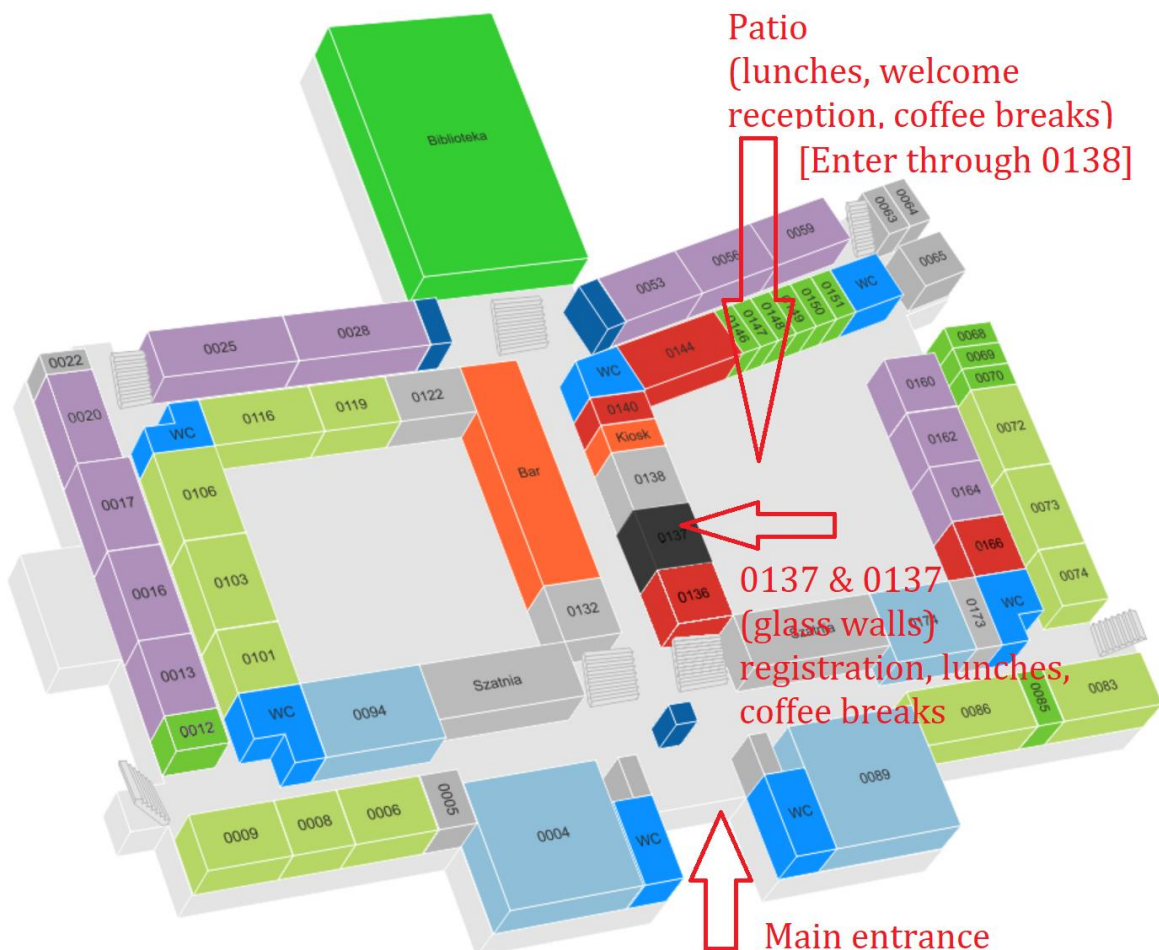
**0137, 0138**, ground floor – registration desk, coffee breaks, lunches will take place here.

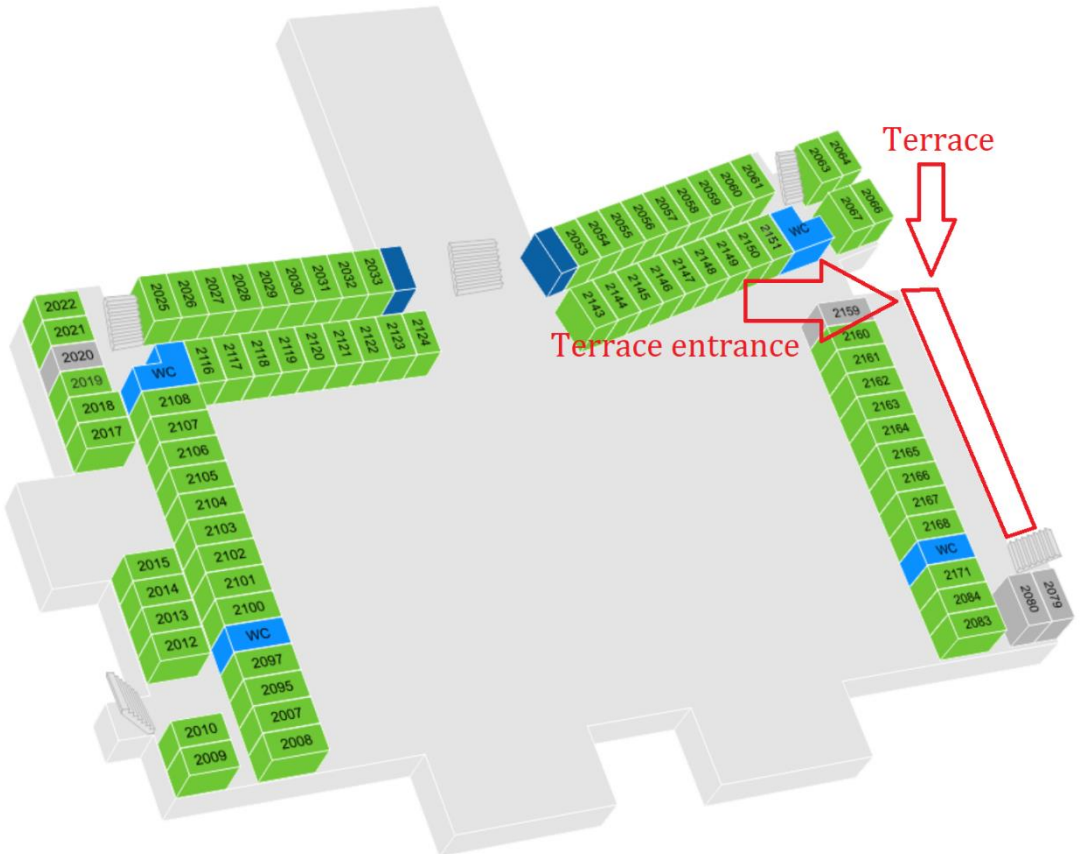
**Bar** (opposite the rooms 0137, 0138) – some lunches might be located here.

**1106**, first floor – a meeting/quiet room, it has blackboards, you can sit, talk, and/or rest here.

You can visit a **terrace on the second floor**, the entrance is located opposite the room 2159. It has a nice view over the garden, and it has a mural inspired by Mathematics and Computer Science, that also employs anamorphosis techniques.

On Monday, at 18:00 there will be **Welcome Reception** in a patio accessible from rooms 0137 and 0138.





# Around Campus

There are several nice places around campus:

- Zakrzówek (old quarry)
- Skalki Twardowskiego (a rocky formation north of the Zakrzówek, great viewpoint over Kraków)
- Nature Education Center – kind of a museum run by the university. It has some dinosaur skeleton on a display near the entrance 😊.
- Green areas – great for running, going on a walk.



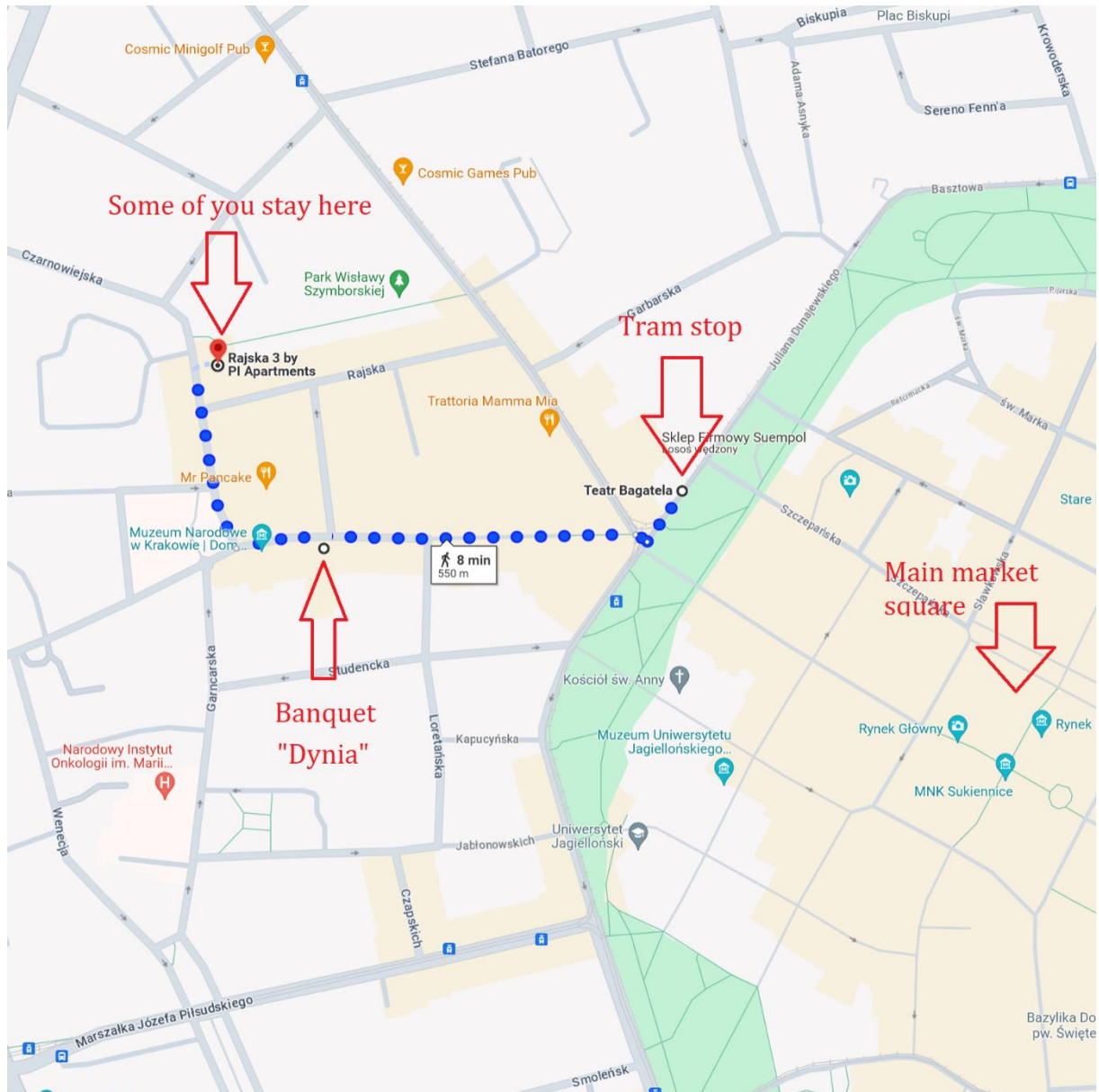


# Banquet (Thursday)

**The location is:** Restobar “Dyňa”, Krupnicza street 20.

It is remarkably close to the city center and Fragola hotels. If you are coming with a Tram, then the best stop is “Teatr Bagatela”.



# In and around Kraków

If you are interested in some sight-seeings, you might consider visiting:

1. Kraków Main Square
2. Kazimierz – the old Jewish district
3. Stare Podgórze – another old district. A big park and the “Liban” quarry are located here (staged in Schindler’s list movie by Spielberg)
4. Kopiec Kościuszki – an artificial mound commemorating one of the best-known Polish (and US) commanders.
5. Wieliczka Salt Mine – very unique place, the oldest Polish salt mine, with intricately decorated underground chapel.
6. Las Wolski and Bielany Cloister – Las wolski is the forest (or maybe a large park) that surrounds Kościuszko Mound and very unique monastery – the Bielany Cloister. The cloister is accessible only for men and only on specific times each day.
7. Tyniec Monastery – one the most recognizable in Poland. You can make a nice bike trip along the Vistula River to get there.
8. John Paul II sanctuary (Łagiewniki) – the commemorative place for the most famous John Paul of Poland. His birth city of Wadowice is located 45 km to the west of Kraków.
9. Zakopane and Tatra mountains. This is rather a big trip, as the largest polish mountain range is located around 100 km south. You can view the mountains from 4<sup>th</sup> or higher floors of some buildings in Kraków. You can go to “Jubilat” store (near Wawel castle) to enjoy the view of the mountains from one of its rooftop restaurants (if the weather is right).
